

LED street lighting trial

We would like your views

We would like your feedback on the new LED street lighting technology which will be trialled in your area from Wednesday 11 March 2015. We believe it will lead to significant cost savings for Stoke-on-Trent City Council in the future and will also reduce carbon emissions.

The trial is part of the partnership between SSE Enterprise Lighting and Stoke-on-Trent City Council, which will see new LED lanterns installed in a total of 23 street lights. The areas in which the trial will be conducted include Boothenwood Terrace, Shelburne Street, Munro Street, James Street, Bakewell Street, Gladstone Place and Penkville Street Back Lane.

Open evening

We are holding an 'open evening' on Wednesday 11 March 2015, from 7pm – 9pm on James Street. SSE Enterprise and Council representatives will be clearly visible at this time and will answer any questions you may have about the new technology. They will pass your feedback to SSE Enterprise Lighting, Stoke-on-Trent City Council and the emergency services. If successful, the trial could lead to street lights across the city being replaced with more efficient and effective technology.
